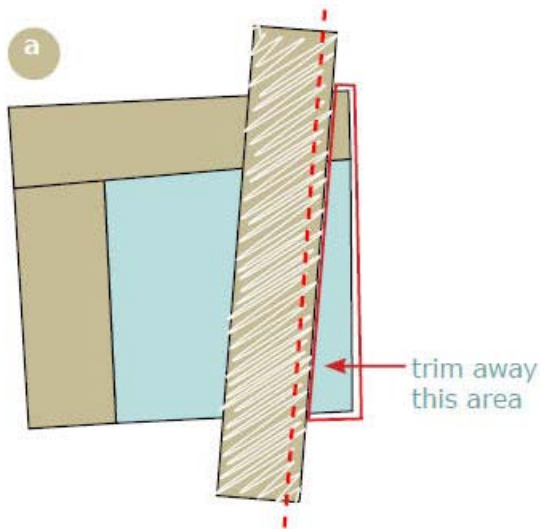
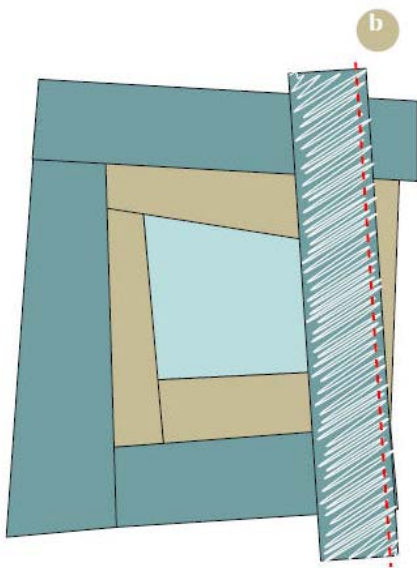




together, to one side of the center square. Do not worry about the strips being exactly parallel to each other and don't worry about matching raw edges with the center square if you would like even more of an angle. Trim off excess fabric beyond the seam allowance. Press open with seam allowance towards the strip you just sewed. Trim off any excess length. Turn the block 90 degrees counter-clockwise and sew on another strip. Cut more strips, if you need to, and sew them, in the same manner, to the remaining two sides of the center square (figure a).



3. Cut a strip, approximately 2 1/2" wide, from a third fabric and sew it, in the same manner, around the previous round (figure b).



When you have sewn strips to all four sides, you should have a block that looks like a lopsided square within a second lopsided square, inside a third.
